A MOTHER'S DREAM

The goal of our parent seminars is to provide parents with key tools to support their children's learning. One mother reflected on her story as she thought about her own children.

"My father was an educated person and wanted to send his daughters to school despite our grandfather's opposition. Our school was far away from our home, It would take 3 hours to reach it. I completed grade 12 before my marriage. I now want my own daughters

to do more and complete a master's program and find a good job. Although I have completed high school, I could not get a good job. I regret that I did not pursue further education due to my own decision to get married. We are financially unstable and I could support my family if only I continued my studies. I do not want my children to regret it. After the seminar, I realized the value of meaningful interaction with my children at home and the benefit of visiting school to check on their progress."

NEW PARTNERSHIP



A door has opened to establish a new partnership area in Province 2 which is located in the Terai. This is an area of Nepal that is often overlooked and we are eager to begin exploring what this partnership could look like. Plans are still being made as to how we can best support. HDCS is also looking to provide child and maternal health education in conjunction with our EQUIP work.

SAYING GOODBYE



EQUIP Happenings

Lamjung

A follow-up visit for Maths, Science, English, Phonics, and ECD highlighted the trip. All ICT teachers were provided with a three day differentiated training on

educational within their context that included a follow up visit to many of the schools. Lamjung schools held a poetry competition facilitated by EQUIP.



Kathmandu

EQUIP continues to expand it's role in the Christian Educators Network and provided an Integrated Training on the new curriculum. Professional Motivation, Numeracy, differentiation and Phonics training were also conducted within the valley.

Rukum

During this visit, training was conducted in Early-Childhood Development, Grade 1-3 Curriculum Integration, and COVID-19 Awareness and Prevention. A Parent Seminar was delivered (below) and a Scholarship Profile was assessed. The team also facilitated the formation of Child Clubs along with a Partnership Agreement among Partner-School Principals.

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Rukum

Poetry competitions were a success in Rukum (and Lamjung). Follow up visits were conducted in childcentered teaching and we checked the use of classroom

Nuwakot

The team provided Phonics and Group Work Training.

Follow-up visits were in Science Instruction Counseling and Group Work. An evaluation of the project was also conducted.



Lamjung

Phonics, English, Maths, and Science Training were all conducted by the team in this first phase of the Nepali year. Reproductive Health and Mensuration and Health Awareness Training were also delivered collaboration with the hospital. A parent seminar for Grade 6-8 parents was lead along with Parent Logbook and Teacher Diary distribution.



The focus of this visit was for follow up visits and refresher training opportunities. This allows for more contextual problem solving as teachers implement the methods being taught. Three additional computer labs were set up through EduTech Nepal (above).
