


EQUALITY DOESN'T MEAN JUSTICE

IN THE CLASSROOM







SMC - FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The KISC annual accounts have just been audited and the accounts presented and discussed at SMC. In Nepal, the financial year runs from mid-July to mid-July. Here are some highlights from the accounts which cover the period from mid-July 2013 to mid-July 2014.

The total budgeted income for last year was Rs. 120 million. Actual income was Rs. 129 million (7% higher than budget). The main reason for this was the higher exchange rate of the rupee against the US dollar and UK sterling. The school also received some donations that had not been budgeted for. One of these covered the costs of renovating the science lab to meet MSA requirements. Over 80% of income for KISC comes from student fees. After this, donations for EQUIP are the next highest source of income.

The total budgeted expenses were Rs. 110 million. The accounts show that the actual expenses were Rs. 128 million. This means we spent 16% more than we had budgeted. Whilst this sounds like a lot, a closer look shows that this is due to a high amount of depreciation. If depreciation is excluded, KISC would have under spent by 5% against the budget. During 2013/14, work was completed on the sports field. As the lease on the land was initially for one year only, the investment on the site was been depreciated over the same period. This has led to a large amount of depreciation showing on the accounts.

Over a third of expenses are directly related to students (teacher salaries, curriculum etc.) Another third is classed as 'Administrative' and this includes salaries of all the office and support staff and the costs of running the campus including the rent of our premises.

Taking actual income and actual expenses, KISC made a surplus of just under Rs. 1 million (Rs. 933,878 to be precise). The end result is that KISC has more money in the bank at the end of July this year compared to a year ago. We have taken this opportunity to allocate more of these funds to the KISC Building Fund which now stands at Rs. 53 million (around \$550,000).

I know that many of you are not that interested in all this but if you do want more information, the accounts can be made available to you. Staff will get a chance to hear a short presentation at a forthcoming staff meeting. I am happy to respond to any specific question you have on behalf of SMC.

EQUIP wants to see the same changes among the teachers who attend the trainings and implement learned activities in their classrooms.

EQUIP Scholarship

At KISC we believe that excellent education is a key to changing mindsets and transforming lives in Nepal. This is the reason KISC EQUIP was established over 7 years ago and why KISC TEC, a teacher training college, is being established. Another opportunity we are privileged to be involved in is to sponsor children in KISC EQUIP partner schools and by providing scholarships at KISC K-13. The KISC scholarship policy is used to determine the total number of students and amounts awarded. These are:

- A maximum of 5 students per Government school and 3 students per private school scholarships will be considered using KISC fee funds.
- The amount for scholarship for the students studying in a Government school is a maximum US\$ 100 per year and those studying in a private school is US\$ 200 per year for 2013. These amounts will be determined by the Scholarship Committee each year.

The last academic year (2013-14) 65 students from EQUIP partner school received scholarships totaling Rs. 9, 05,688. EQUIP received donations for all of the students supported. This year (2014-15), we have provided 81 scholarships at a total of Rs.12, 04, 115. This year, EQUIP is still receiving donations, however KISC have committed to support up to one child at a KISC EQUIP partner school for each full fee paying student if there is a deficit in donations. Support provided by KISC will be reported annually.

EQUIP would like to extend its appreciation to the whole KISC community for their heart to support EQUIP to bring transformation to Nepali school communities. This year 9 students finished their SLC (secondary school) with the scholarship support from KISC EQUIP. They may not have been able to continue their study otherwise.
